### Elementary School Animal Safety Program



#### Lesson 1: Animal Safety Passport

Supplies: Passport and stickers pdf, paper, stickers, staples

Instructions: Print a passport for each student using the file and instructions in the pdf. Print stickers to match each page of the passport. Place the stickers around the room and have the students find a sticker for each page of the passport.

**What they learn:** What is a pet. What is wildlife. What is harmful to the humans, dogs, cats, and wildlife. What dogs can eat. Something they may not know (like a microchip or a service dog).



#### Lesson 2: Turtle Safety Craft

Supplies: Turtle and arrow template pdf, yellow and green paper, individual applesauce, tape, scissors.

Instructions: Print a turtle and arrow for each student. Turtles on green paper. Arrows on yellow paper. Students cut out one turtle and one arrow. Using tape, affix the applesauce upside down to the turtle creating a "shell." Tape the arrow to the applesauce facing forward.

**What they learn:** Turtles in need of assistance should only be moved in the direction they are facing. Never turn them around.

#### More information about turtles:

- They can live more than 50 years, if you leave them in their habitat
- They spend their entire life within about a mile of where they hatched.
- Never paint or mark a turtle's shell. That can make them sick.



#### Lesson 3: Animal Safety Challenge Coloring Sheet

Supplies: Coloring Sheet pdf, red and green crayons

Instructions: Each student receives a coloring sheet and a red and green crayon. Color in the pictures red if they are unsafe and green if they are safe.

Teacher guide is on the second page.

**What they learn:** Some foods and plants are dangerous for cats and dogs. People food should not be given to pets because it can make them sick.

#### **Animal Safety Passport**

Supplies: Passport and stickers, paper, stickers, staples

Instructions: Print a passport for each student using the file and instructions in this pdf. Print double-sided pages: Cover (inside and outside); pages 2/7, 8/1; pages 4/5, 6/3. There are two passports per each set printed. Cut sheets in half horizontally. Collate the passports using the page numbers. Staple the center of the booklet spine.

Print stickers to match each page of the passport. Place the stickers around the room and have the students find a sticker for each page of the passport.

What they learn: What is a pet. What is wildlife. What is harmful to the humans, dogs, cats, and wildlife. What dogs can eat. Something they may not know (like a microchip or a service dog).
